We request the commission review the proposed transaction detailed below and issue an Advisory Opinion to the above committee.

Proposed Transaction The Monmouth County Republican Committee has requested The Committee to Re-Elect Congressman Chris Smith to Collateralize a loan it is negotiating with a Bank. The Bank will require the Congressman's Committee to deposit up to \$20,000 in a CD with said Bank. The CD will be released as collateral when the County's Committee repays the loan. The initial term is not expected to exceed six months. The CD will bear a fair rate of interest payable to the Congressman's Committee.

The Monmouth County Republican Committee is not registered with the Federal Election Commission but is a local political party campaign fund.

The \$20,000 that the Congressman's Committee will use to purchase the CD are "Excess Campaign Funds" from the Committee's November 1988 election.

The only involvement of The Congressman's Committee is to collateralize the loan. All terms of repayment, interest rates and loan term have been independently negotiated by the Bank and responsible members of the County's Committee.
