First, all communications by NRL and any person on its behalf, the candidates themselves, the candidates' staff members, representatives and agents must not expressly advocate the nomination, election or defeat of any candidate. 4/ However, anyone introducing the speakers may briefly note the fact that the speaker is a candidate.

5/ For example, the introduction may indicate that the speaker "is a candidate for President," but may not describe the speaker as "the next President," or "a strong pro-life supporter who will be our pro-life President," or state that "we need-to keep Congressmen like him in Congress." These examples are also applicable to a subsequent press conference conducted by NRL during the convention.

Page 9 Line 16

With respect to the NRL-sponsored press conference to be held at or near the convention site before, during or after the convention, the Commission concludes that the candidate speakers may participate in the press conference to discuss pro-life issues and may be identified as candidates so long as NRL does not endorse the candidates during the press conference.
