Ms. Waldstreicher,

Thank you for speaking with me about the DSCC's advisory opinion request and for helping move the request through the process. We do not intend to submit a revised version of the request based on Advisory Opinion 1985-19. We reviewed the opinion prior to submitting the request and believe that the precedent cited in the DSCC's request is far more applicable to the facts at hand.

In Advisory Opinion 1985-19 a candidate committee proposed to share a joint asset with a corporation. The Commission opined that on those facts, the corporation would be "financing" or "subsidizing" campaign activities. As discussed in our advisory opinion request, the Commission has repeatedly determined the calculation of the benefit reasonably expected to be derived by a federal candidate to equal only a proportion of the total expense, even when other political committees may have access to, and use for, the entire resource.

To our knowledge, Advisory Opinion 1985-19 has only been cited one other time in Advisory Opinion 1989-13, in which the Commission found a corporation's plan to provide computers, software, and technical training for accounting purposes to be a prohibited corporate contribution. Both advisory opinions focus on the value provided to a committee in the context of the explicit prohibition on corporate contributions. 11 CFR § 114.2(b). The facts in our advisory opinion request are more comparable to the opinions cited, which involve allocating expenses between federal candidate committees and other committees consistent with 11 CFR § 106.1.
