2 reporting obligations, the Act further requires additional independent expenditure reporting

within 24 hours of the expenditure when a person makes or contracts to make independent

expenditures aggregating \$1,000 or more after the 20th day but more than 24 hours before the

5 date of an election.⁷

Further, a political committee that makes or contracts to make independent expenditures aggregating \$10,000 or more outside of that 20-day period, up to and including the 20th day, must file a report describing those expenditures within 48 hours. These reports must be filed within 48 hours "following the date on which a communication that constitutes an independent expenditure is publicly distributed or otherwise publicly disseminated."

In 2016, the 20-day period for the Louisiana general election began on October 20;¹⁰ thus, an independent expenditure made by a political committee before that date aggregating \$10,000 or more needed to be additionally disclosed in a 48-Hour Report.

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I. INTRODUCTION

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This matter was generated based on information ascertained by the Federal Election

10 Commission ("Commission") in the normal course of carrying out its supervisory

responsibilities, see 52 U.S.C. § 30109(a)(2). The Commission's Reports Analysis Division

("RAD") referred Warrior PAC and Robert San Luis in his official capacity as treasurer

("Committee") to the Office of General Counsel for failing to file four 48-Hour Reports of

Independent Expenditures ("IEs") during the 2016 election cycle. For the reasons set forth

below, the Commission finds reason to believe that the Committee violated 52 U.S.C.

16 § 30104(g).

17 II. FACTS

The Committee is an independent-expenditure-only political committee that registered with the Commission in June 2016.² In its October 2016 Quarterly Report, the Committee disclosed on Schedule E that on September 17, it disseminated an IE supporting U.S. Senate candidate Robert L. Maness in the Louisiana general election totaling \$108,662.40.³ That

In addition to a political committee's regular reporting obligations, the Act further requires additional independent expenditure reporting within 24 hours of the expenditure when a person makes or contracts to make independent expenditures aggregating \$1,000 or more after the 20th day but more than 24 hours before the date of an election.
