The Federal Election Commission has considered the allegations contained in your complaint dated September 4, 2018, but was equally divided on whether to dismiss the allegations that the Committee to Elect Suraj Patel and Nayna Patel in her official capacity as treasurer and Suraj Patel violated 11 C.F.R.§ 102.9(e)(2), and whether to find no reason to believe that Suraj Patel in his individual capacity violated 11 C.F.R.§ 102.9(e)(2), a regulatory provision of the Federal Election Campaign Act of 1971, as amended. Accordingly, on July 9, 2019, the Commission closed the file in this matter. A Statement of Reasons providing a basis for the Commission's decision may follow.

Documents related to the case will be placed on the public record within 30 days. See Disclosure of Certain Documents in Enforcement and Other Matters, 81 Fed. Reg. 50,702 (Aug. 2, 2016), effective September 1, 2016.
