Dear Mr. Spies and Mr. Ross:

On November 13, 2018, the Federal Election Commission notified your clients, Congressman William P. Huizenga, Huizenga for Congress and David Nienhuis in his official capacity as Treasurer, and Natalie Huizenga of a complaint alleging that they had violated certain sections of the Federal Election Campaign Act of 1971, as amended.

On June 4, 2019, the Commission considered the complaint but was equally divided on whether to find reason to believe that William P. Huizenga, Huizenga for Congress and David Nienhuis in his official capacity as Treasurer, and Natalie Huizenga violated 52 U.S.C. § 30114(b). The Commission was also equally divided on whether to find reason to believe that Huizenga for Congress and David Nienhuis in his official capacity as Treasurer violated 52 U.S.C. §§ 30104(b)(5)(A) and (b)(6)(A). Accordingly, the Commission closed its file in this matter.
